

# iBooks: Viewing & Saving PDFs on iPhone, iPad, and iPod touch

With iBooks for iOS and iTunes 10.1 or later, you can view & save PDFs on your compatible iOS device. You can also view PDF email attachments or PDFs from Safari in iBooks.

iBooks 3.2 or later requires iOS 7 or later on your iPhone, iPad, or iPod touch. If you can't install iOS 7 on your device, [follow these steps](#).

## Opening PDFs with iBooks

You can open PDF documents with iBooks:

1. Once you download and enter your password you will be viewing the PDF through your browser.
2. When viewing tap the bottom left corner, a frame will come around the document. In the top right corner it will request that you indicate what program you would like to open the document in.
3. Tap Open in iBooks to open the attachment. iBooks will open, and you can view your PDF.

When you use iBooks to open a PDF, iBooks will automatically save a copy of the PDF to your iBooks PDF shelf. These PDFs will sync to your iTunes Book library the next time you sync your device with iTunes.

## **Viewing and Saving PDF's to your Android based device**

1. Install the Adobe Reader for [Android application](#) (see Resources this is a free application). Adobe is one of the most well-known names in the PDF world, having created the format. Using the Adobe Reader application, you can view PDF files you've saved to your phone or those located on the Web.

2. Once the document is downloaded to your device it will be stored in your downloads, and will remain there permanently until you decide to delete it.
3. When opening the document you will be asked as to what program you wish to open the document in. At this point select the program desired.

## **Viewing and Saving PDF's to your PC Desktop**

1. Download the document and wait for it to open
2. Enter Password
3. Drag your mouse to the bottom of the page
4. Click on the left icon that looks like a disk and says save a copy
5. You will now have the option to rename the document and save wherever you wish on your PC

## **Viewing and Saving PDF's to your Mac Desktop**

1. Download the document
2. Go to your downloads folder to find the document
3. Enter Password
4. Click file in the top left corner of the screen

5. Click save as
6. You will now have the option to rename the document and save wherever you wish on your Mac
